It has light yellow anthers and yellow filaments. The flower is long lasting. The bloom has 2 rows of guard petals, numbering about 14 to 18. The outside row flat or slightly curved back and the inside row often folded and turned upright producing "rabbit ears". The inside of bloom is a profusion of about 110 to 190 petaloids mixed with hidden stamens and a few larger curved irregular upright petals. It won the Best Seedling award at the Gulf Coast Shows in the early 1980's.

The 4.50" semi-double light fuchsia bloom has yellow anthers and white filaments. The anthers are distributed in bunches amongst the petals. It blooms mid-season to late, is long lasting, falls in one piece and blooms show consistent form.

The flower falls in Ruth C. one piece, has a slight fragrance, a heavy petal texture and is consistent in form. 3 to 4 rows of large, broad, layered outer petals which are slightly down-curved. Inner petals are upward and fluted and sometimes crinkled and irregular. It won a Best Seedling award in the Gulf Coast Show in the 1980's.
