Camellia Growing Experiences by Kathleen Beecher

John Tingley and I attended the Camellia Club's air layering demos at the UWF Garden in February 2019 and joined the club that day. We thought the camellias at the UWF site were beautiful, and started purchasing camellias shortly after that. We have had much trial and error with them. We live in Perdido Key, and the soil is sandy, along with most of our yard being in full sun. We're from Maine and used to planting very deep to avoid the frost line (a \$20 hole for a \$5 plant is the advice in New England.) Hurricane Sally brought an abundance of salt water to our yard. So, planting too deep, not adding enough enrichment to the sandy soil, planting in full sun, and too much salt water may have been reasons we lost some of our original camellias. We are doing much better now. John took over the planting, moved camellias to new sites and planted newly purchased varieties in better locations. This year, we have many blooms.

Below are some of my favorite camellias. At the UWF Garden, you can experience the beautiful Sea foam, La Peppermint, and Pink Perfection Camellias. There are also Sea foam, Pink Perfection, and Professor Charles Sargent Camellias at the Mobile Botanical Garden.
