February 25th Community Camellia Show and Plant Sale

Here are a few tips for those Novices bringing blooms to their first show.

Select the freshest blooms. Protect the flowers in poly fiber or other fluffy, soft material so that they will not bruise in transit. A plastic container with a lid or a tin cake pan with a lid works well. Place a moist paper towel on the bottom to keep it fresh if you gather your bloom earlier in the week and refrigerate them. The blooms should not touch each other or any hard surface, to avoid bruising.

Between 8:00 and 9:30 am bring your blooms to the Pensacola downtown library; enter from the north doors where the plant sale will be set up outside. There will be tables with water pitchers and various size display cups for you to prepare your blooms for showing. Put some water in the display cup that best supports your camellia bloom, prune the stem (bring your clippers) to fit the cup. Judges will be looking for blooms with two leaves, remove any extras.

Entry cards must be filled out for each camellia that you enter. Bring some address labels with your name for the entry cards to save time.

If you are not sure of the name of your blossom, ask any PCC member for help. We may not be able to identify it in time for the show, but if we can't, it will go on a special table for judges and others to give their opinions as to the name. They will consult the <u>2017 Nomenclature Book</u> to determine the type. If you need help filling out the entry card, just ask us for assistance. Once you have your bloom ready to go, a Camellia Club member will take it to the proper display area. Do not try to place it there yourself.

Categories including Novice and Best Local Unprotected (not grown in a greenhouse) blooms will be in the judging for prizes to be awarded. More flowers make an even more beautiful and successful show, so bring them in, you could be a prize winner! Bring camellia blooms to the Library between 8:00 a.m. - 9:30 a.m. Saturday morning. Judging starts at 10:00 am to 11:00, while that is happening visit our membership desk; dues are \$10.00 per year. Outside there will be camellia plants for sale for \$25.00. Be patient, after the judging is over the awards and blooms will be open to public viewing from 11:30 to 3:30 p.m. come back to see if you have won a prize.

Determine **size** of the bloom by: **Min**iature (2 ½ inches or less) **S**mall (over 2 ½ inches 2 to 3 inches) **M**edium (over 3 inches to 4 inches) **L**arge (over 4 inches to 5 inches) **V**ery Large (over 5 inches) Sizes are based on normal outside growth with no chemical treatment.

Chemically Treated – just a Yes/ No question.

Division: IV : Noivice

White Card , one must be completed for each bloom that you enter.

Class No with examples; Class I - SINGLE

One row of 5 -8 petals; regular, irregular or loose petals with conspicuous stamens with or without petaloids.



'YULETIDE' (SINGLE)

Class II - SEMIDOUBLE

Two or more rows of large regular, irregular or loose petals – nine or more. Very prominent stamens, sometimes with petaloids. The petals may overlap or be in rows. Sometimes blooms can have a concave center.



'BETTY FOY SANDERS' (SEMIDOUBLE)

Class III - ANEMONE

One or more rows of large outer guard petals, lying flat or undulating; the center is a convex mass of intermingled petaloids and stamens.



'ELEGANS SPLENDOR' (ANENOME)

Class IV - PEONY (Loose)

Loose petals which maybe irregular with (1) intermingled stamens or (2) with intermingled petals, petaloids and stamens in the center.



'MAROON AND GOLD' (LOOSE PEONY)

PEONY (Full form) Convex mass of mixed irregular petals and petaloids with or without stamens showing.



'MARGARET DAVIS' (FULL PEONY)

Class V – ROSE FORMAL DOUBLE

Rows of imbricated or overlapping petals appearing as a rose bud in the early stage maturing to an open bud showing stamens in a concave center.



'SENRITSU-KO' (ROSE FORM DOUBLE)

Class VI – FORMAL DOUBLE

Many rows of overlapping petals, never showing stamens. It usually has a center of tightly furled petals.



'NUCCIO'S GEM' (FORMAL DOUBLE)
