Second Vice President Larry Morris gave an excellent program on "Camellia Pests and diseases; How to Control Them."

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Minutes were approved as printed/e-mailed in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Thekla Morris reported a balance of \$3,888.14 in checking account. She reported that insurance on our pick-up truck has been paid--\$900.

Newsletter: The members expressed satisfaction with our first effort at e-mailing of the newsletter. Those without e-mail still get

newsletter by US Postal service. Carol Comber, editor, reported no significant problems with newsletter production.

PCC Foundation: Roger Vinson reported that savings balance in Foundation is \$44,831.94.

Plant Sales: Judy Kerr reported, in Dick Hooton's absence, that there are 288 plants in the Shade House. There are two more

buying trips planned before the December 12-13 Camellia Show. She also reported that Shade House needs more weeding done.

Judges School: Gabriel "Ole" Olsen announced that the school would be held Saturday after Thanksgiving, Nov 28, beginning at 9 a.m. at St. Christopher's Episcopal Church Parish Hall, 3200 N. 12th Ave. This should appeal to persons who wish to become novice judges as well as persons
