### PENSACOLA CAMELLIA CLUB MINUTES MEMBERSHIP MEETING TUESDAY OCTOBER 16, 2012

The regular third-Tuesday meeting of the Pensacola Camellia Club convened at the Garden Center at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday October 16, 2012 PROGRAM: Following the social time, President John Davy called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and introduced Skip Vogelsang who discussed air-layering as means of propagating camellias. His special emphasis was on harvesting and potting airlayers. He demonstrated by bringing his own air layered specimens and showed how and when to harvest. Don't harvest too early when root ball is not well established.

Shade House work-day: will be Saturday October 20 beginning at 9:00 a.m. Those having airlayered camellias are asked to bring them to the shade house that day for potting. Lots of work to be done, so all are encouraged to participate. Usually work is completed before noon. Shade house is on Pine Forest road, about 1 mile north of Nine-Mile Road. (On the left, going north). If you need specific directions, call Dick Hooton at 850-969-0001.

Vests: Christi Hankins demonstrated vests which had been purchased by the club for use at the camellia shows. They will be embroidered with the logo of the Pensacola Camellia Club and kept by Dick Hooton for recurrent use. December Camellia Show: Skip Vogelsang explained the changes for our show on Saturday December 8 at First Baptist Church. This is a new location and a new procedure. This will require many volunteers for bloom placement (previously exhibitors placed their own blooms.) Also, will need volunteers to help exhibitors in getting blooms from their vehicles to the bloom preparation area. New member Daniel Leonard, University of Florida horticulture student at the Milton campus, will try to recruit his classmates to help with this effort. U of FL horticulture program: Erin Tinney, Academic Program Recruiter, U of FL program at Milton campus, spoke about the program. Cost is approx. \$155/ credit hour.
