



#### You Can Do This... Come Learn and Have Fun!


Bring one or many blooms to the Dec 14<sup>th</sup> show between 7 and 10am to the Bloom Prep area. Friday's setup helpers will have placed trays, cups of various sizes and water pitchers, for you to prepare your blooms. You need to find the correct size cup for your bloom to sit above the cup to support the bloom.



You will complete the correct entry card per the show rules



From there our 'Bloom Placement' volunteers will bring your blooms and entry card to the check in station where it will be reviewed for accuracy.

At 10:30 the accredited ACS judges will work in teams with clerks and runners to assist. As a clerk and runner you can hear their discussion as they determine which blooms are



worthy to move to the contention table/ head table. The runner will take bloom and entry card to that table. The judging will then continue around the contention table as final award decisions are made. Judging will be completed and the show opens for Public Viewing at 1pm.



## Pensacola Camellia Club 86th Annual Camellia Show Dec 14th 2024

#### Below are the Show Rules

- 1. This show is held in cooperation with the American Camellia Society (ACS). The ACS Show Rules and Regulations (eff. July 1, 2017) will apply, except as otherwise set out herein. The decision of the judges will be final.
- 2. Entries will be received Saturday, December 14, 2024, from **7 am to 10 am** with judging to follow at 10:30 am. The show will open to the public at 1 pm. Exhibitors will not place their own blooms. The show is open to any camellia grower.
- 3. Nomenclature authority: Chapter II, Section 3, ACS Show Rules and Regulations. Cultivars with multiple names will be entered under the preferred name in the current *Camellia Nomenclature*, published by the Southern California Camellia Society, its supplement or as listed on the ACS website. When a camellia variety is listed as "medium to large" it will be judged in the Medium to Large category, when listed as "small to medium" it will be judged in the smaller size category. *The only exception will be blooms registered as "miniature to small" which will be judged as small. Only blooms registered as "miniature" shall be judged as miniature. Unprotected blooms are those grown without man-made protection such as a greenhouse or shade cloth.*
- 4. ACS entry cards for classifying blooms will be available at the show and should be consistent with nomenclature authority as listed in Rule 3.

WHITE CARDS: Unprotected Japonicas with Class Number GREEN CARDS: Protected Japonicas with Class Number

YELLOW CARDS: All Retics with Class Number

**BLUE CARDS: All Non-Retic Hybrids with Class Number** 

**RED CARDS:** Species and Sports or Mutations with Class Number

PINK CARDS: Seedlings with Class Number

NOVICE/STUDENT: White cards marked in accordance with Rule 10b & Class#.

- 5. Each entry will be eligible for only one award.
- 6. Only judges and authorized persons will be permitted in the exhibition area during judging. Judges may decide not to award ribbons if certain varieties deemed to be below show quality.
- 7. All blooms entered must be grown by the exhibitor, and the plant must be in the exhibitor's possession at least thirty days prior to the show. All blooms become the property of the Pensacola Camellia Club and will be disposed of by the show committee.
- 8. Each container/cup must have only 1 bloom and must show either one or two leaves, except for sprays which will be entered in accordance with Rule 11. For seedling and sport entries, two blooms may be entered under one card in order to assist judges in evaluating the bloom.
- 9. Novice/Student:
  - a) Open to exhibitors who have not won more than 3 awards at the head table of any camellia show.
  - b) Special white entry cards shall be marked "Novice" and available at the show, or the exhibitor may write "Novice" on a regular white entry card.
  - c) Only known (named) blooms grown unprotected may be entered in this class.
  - d) Awards will be given for size categories and not species or variety.
  - e) If warranted, a Best Novice/Student Bloom may be considered for any of the Special Awards, (subject to Rule 6).

#### 11. Sprays:

- a) The spray of buds or blooms on one stem should be no taller than 8 inches above the top of the container provided at the show. There is no limit as to the number of buds, leaves or blooms.
- b) The category is open to all species and varieties either protected or unprotected.


